


## Welcome to our walking tour

Let's go!

YOUR EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCES AT PORTSMOUTH WILL PREPARE YOU FOR A GREAT FUTURE. 97.5 PER CENT OF OUR GRADUATES ARE WORKING OR IN FURTHER STUDY (DLHE 2017). SO LET'S START AT THE **CAREERS AND EMPLOYABILITY SERVICE** (40). AS WELL AS ADVISING YOU ON YOUR CAREER CHOICES, THE TEAM CAN HELP YOU FIND PART-TIME WORK, VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITIES, MENTORING, INTERNSHIPS AND WORK EXPERIENCE.

Look up to see Rosalind Franklin Halls (40), student accommodation. From Careers and Employability, walk on past the bars and clubs of Guildhall Walk. Down the first road on your left, you'll see White Swan Building (14), home of our performing arts courses. Linked to the New Theatre Royal (J), it houses a TV studio, performance studios and music practice rooms. On the other side of this street, just beyond Rosalind Franklin Halls, is St Michael's Building (13), for pharmacy and biomedical science.

At the top of Guildhall Walk is Guildhall Square.
On the left you'll see **Portsmouth Guildhall (E)** — that's where your graduation ceremony will happen.

Just before you get to the Square, turn left onto King Henry I Street. Along here, you'll find the historic **Park Building (11)** on your right. This was the first building to be part of the future University. It is home to one of the UK's largest schools of language and area studies.

Ahead of you, at the end of King Henry I Street, is **King Henry Building (12)** – this is where psychology and biological sciences are taught.

Take the pedestrian path to the right of King Henry Building. Next, cross over at the traffic lights on the main road and turn right. The University building on your left is **Anglesea Building (7)**. It's the home of engineering, as well as our law school and the replica law court. Printing Services are based here, to help with your printing needs.

Walk through Anglesea Building and keep going. Straight ahead is **Burnaby Building (5)**, for earth and environmental sciences, and civil engineering labs.

At Burnaby, go left and follow the path around the building. On your right is **Dennis Sciama Building (9).** Here you'll find one of our students' favourite cafes – The Hub – as well as cosmology and gravitation. Just past Dennis Sciama, you'll find yourself in the middle of our Northern Quarter.


Straight in front of you is **Richmond Building (6)**, home of business and law, with amazing facilities including our Bloomberg Suite, SAP Lab and Business Simulation Suite. On your right is **Buckingham Building (4)** where geography and computer studies happen.


















Pass through the brown gates to your right and you'll see our new, £12m Future Technology Centre (3) ahead of you. Just behind it is Lion Gate Building (1), home of computing and mathematics.

To the left of the Future Technology Centre is **Portland Building (2)** — an award-winning example of sustainable architecture, designed by our Professor of Architectural Design, Sir Colin Stansfield-Smith. It's had a £9m refurbishment to include more PCs, a hydraulics lab, great learning spaces and a café. Portland is home to civil engineering, surveying and property development.


Exit the Northern Quarter with Dennis Sciama (9) to your left and Richmond (6) to your right. As you walk towards the railway bridge up ahead, you'll see Milldam Building (8) on your right. This former military barracks now houses social, historical and literary studies. Behind it is the University Nursery, which cares for students' children. Opposite Milldam is Burnaby Terrace (10) – a row of Victorian terraced houses, refurbished to house business and law staff. Carry on under the railway bridge and stop at the crossroads. If you head right, you'll reach Gunwharf Quays – packed with designer outlets, restaurants, and the Emirates Spinnaker Tower.

Right now, it's time to continue your tour of the University. At the crossroads, cross straight over and go all the way along Burnaby Road. At the end, straight across the road, you'll see the University Library (27). Open 24/7 in term time, it gives you access to information in all kinds of formats, to help you study and research. If you're passionate about education and continuing studies, you'll want to take a quick detour now to St George's Building (29). Turn right at the Library (27) and walk down to the roundabout. You'll see St George's straight ahead, opposite Portsmouth Grammar School.

Standing directly in front of the **Library (27)**, turn to your left and carry on up Cambridge Road. On your right you'll come to the **Students' Union (25)**. This is home to our social learning venue 3rd Space, the Waterhole Bar and the student activities centre. It's a place to party, study, feast and chill out. Your Student Union representatives are based here, and it's a hub for all kinds of societies and sports clubs. What's more, you can pick up University branded merchandise at the shop. You'll also see Student IT Help, the Co-op convenience store and, on the corner, our new community Eye Clinic, which offers free eye tests.

Across the road from the Union is the **Spinnaker Sports Centre (22)**. With the latest indoor facilities, it's perfect for a range of fitness classes, gym workouts and social sports.


Behind the Sports Centre is the **Spinnaker Building (18)**, home to sport and exercise science. This purpose-built facility houses world-class laboratories, including two high specification climatic chambers, an immersion facility and an integrated swimming flume.

On the corner ahead, next to the Sports Centre, you'll come to the **Nuffield Centre (19)**. This houses a range of student advice services – from additional support to academic skills. It's also home to University of Portsmouth Global, the chaplaincy and a doctors' surgery. On the ground floor you'll find the MyPort Information Hub – which is the place to go and get answers to your questions about student life.

After checking out the Nuffield Centre, cross over at the crossing. Head towards the Eye Clinic and Café Coco, and walk between them. Pass under the walkway, and through the area known as Gunhouse Green, with the **Union (25)** on your right.

Continue along with the **Library (27)** on your right. You're now in **Ravelin Park**, and you'll come to a 'crossroads' level with the rear of the Library. You have a choice here.

If you carry on at the crossroads you'll come to Ravelin House (30) on your left, just before the path joins Museum Road. This is a leading centre for all kinds of criminal justice research and studies, and one of the biggest departments of its type in the UK. Alternatively, if you head left at the crossroads you'll quickly come to our Dental Academy (28). On the corner of Ravelin Park to your right, you may see some building works. This is where we're building a new Sports Centre, which will be one of the greenest in the UK.

Now head back the way you came, and cross the road directly opposite the Eye Clinic. Walk past Mercantile House (20), the cream tower block where lots of University administrative offices are based, and take the immediate left. Just before the main junction, you'll find St Andrew's Court (17). This houses the latest facilities for developing tomorrow's health-related scientists. Cross at the junction ahead, so you're on the same side of the road as University House (21), where the Vice-Chancellor's Office is based.

Continue along Winston Churchill Avenue and stop at the second turning on your right- Middle Street. On this corner, to your right, is **Trafalgar Halls** (39), recently refurbished student accommodation with 288 rooms. On the corner opposite is **Eldon Building (31)**, which is home to a variety of courses spanning creative and cultural industries, architecture, art and design, creative technologies, media and performing arts. Inside Eldon you can discover a host of industry-standard facilities ranging from animation and design studios, to virtual reality and motion capture suites.























Continue along Winston Churchill Avenue and cross at the next crossing. Take the wide path between the Courts of Justice and Crown House (G). You'll come to Harry Law Hall (38) on the left (home to 286 students in en suite rooms) and Bateson Hall (37) on the right (282 student rooms with shared facilities). Continue along this path between the two halls, and you will find yourself in Guildhall Square.








If you retrace your steps back to the **train station (C)** and turn right, passing under the railway bridge, you'll be able to see **Catherine House (33)** to your left, on the corner of Victoria Park. This opened in 2017 and has 709 en suite rooms.



If you'd like to go back to where you began the tour, turn around and walk towards Guildhall Square (the railway station will be on your left). Pass under the **Civic Offices**, through the Square and keep going straight ahead, onto Guildhall Walk. You will pass the **New Theatre Royal** on your right. Towards the end of the road, you'll arrive back at the **Careers and Employability Service**.
